1. Notes / Action points of last meeting

- Notes confirmed.
- Tom to copy e-mail from County Council in order for John to respond about better engagement. County Council representative still to attend a meeting.
- Steve to look at what further statistics could be provided by the local teams. Provision of violent and domestic crime raised at Area Committee. Question over what use or confidence these statistics could provide?
- John to arrange for speed survey in Church End, after establishing best location. Checks have been made by PCSOs. Possible perception of speeding due to geography of area with cars using lower gears at high revs and generating noise? John to check with councillors.
- Area Committee was good with a few challenging questions raised.

2. Review of previous Priorities / Actions

- Drug-misuse and associated ASB in Arran Close, Cherry Hinton.**
Councillors thanked police and partners for work in the area. Discharged.
- Anti-social and off road use of mopeds - Cherry Hinton and Queen Ediths.**
Report well received but problem now displaced. Keep as priority with hope that growing inclement weather will dull problem. PCSOs seize mopeds and record as s59 on PNC.
- Youth ASB at High Street, Cherry Hinton.**
Problem now displaced to Rec and Malletts Road. Police to look at "quiet time" as nights draw in and adjust police presence as appropriate.

3. New Priorities

- Anti-social and off road use of mopeds - Cherry Hinton and Queen Ediths.**
Continuation of previous priority. Police to lead.
- Youth ASB at High Street, Cherry Hinton, Malletts Road and Rec.**
Continuation of previous priority, expanded to encompass areas where problem displaced. Police to lead.
- Anti-social parking outside schools (primarily Morley Memorial and Queen Edith Primary Schools).**
Focus on education/information rather than enforcement. Fire service can leaflet area, if required. Police to lead.

4. Any other issues

- No questions raised during Open Forum.
- Arran Close and Rec. – monitor activity.
- Vehicle damage in Cherry Hinton.
- Private CCTV – images purporting to show cycle theft but none shown.
- Underage drinking (Malletts Road).

- ❑ Publication of new police 101 non-emergency number (national launch today) – question over call charges.
- ❑ Request for details from police surgeries.
- ❑ Students from Long Road 6th Form College suspected of being disruptive in food court area at Addenbrooke's and trespassing on Kid's Unlimited property. Police monitoring.
- ❑ Question raised over ASB table on page 6 of profile. Agreed table to be removed from future profiles.
- ❑ Anti-social parking outside schools.
- ❑ Arson on allotment. Arsonist recently released from prison – police are aware.

5. AOB

- ❑ ASB/cycle theft in Trumpington raised at Area Committee. No notable hotspots in area relating to ASB but cycle theft an issue in Newtown. Police to focus on area with education on bike security and use of Immobilise.
- ❑ Lynda raised issue of NAG accountability and will sit with John to revise ToR.
- ❑ ASB Team has drawn up a list (not exhaustive) of ASB indicators.

Summary of action points

- ❑ John to work with police colleagues and see if further breakdown of violent and domestic crime statistics can be undertaken.
- ❑ John to contact councillors to gauge possible perception of speeding in Church End.
- ❑ Lynda and John to meet to revise NAG ToR to address accountability issue.
